I. Office Manager's Report:

BOD Meeting - Office Report Thursday, September 13, 2018

 <u>1. Memberships:</u>
 As of December 7th, 2018, we currently have 11 regular members signed up for 2019.
 We currently have 4 youth signed up for 2019
 We have 115 LIFE Members.
 We have 3 judges that have paid their 2019 judges dues.

2. Shows:

As of today, December 7^{th} , 2018 there are currently 3 shows on the ALSA calendar for 2019.

<u>3. Goals of Office for December 2018:</u> The primary goal of the ALSA office is finish posting all remaining shows for 2018.

The office is also working on new and renewing memberships for 2019.

The Indiana State Fair, held in August, just submitted its results December 12th. Robin did say she is supposed to receive show results within 15 days but gives them lots of time as it is a joint 4-H, ILR and ALSA show.

Still not reporting is the Higher Ground Show from September, even though Robin is now working on entering the September shows' results. She pointed out she tries to be compassionate as possible, recognizing that people sometimes cannot get results in because they work and so forth.

Robin commented that she hoped to finish ALL show postings for 2018 shows by the end of the year.

Robin left the conference call at 7:16 p.m.

Motion: To accept the Office Manager's report as presented. Motion by Carol. Seconded by Lauren. Motion carried.

B. The Office expenses for November are as follows:

A discussion was had about just what Office expenses ALSA is contractually required to pay and which expenses were delineated in Robin Turell's contract for which she is responsible. It was decided that a contract attorney be hired to review the contract and advise the Board as to this matter.

Motion: Delay payment to Robin Turell of the Office expense until the contract is reviewed as to its provisions. Motion by Cathie. Seconded by Deb. Motion unanimously passed.

II. Treasurer's Report:

Vern Wright discussed his extensive efforts during the past two weeks to lower the communications costs within the Office, which for November totaled \$303.62. Verizon associates had told Vern that much of the equipment being used as either outdated or unnecessary with today's technology. In fact, by using a newer IPhone, the Office could eliminate quite a few pieces of equipment, including jet packs, Go to My PC, and the fax line (Which rarely has been used in the past year. An IPAD that is part of this contract will be sent to Ron for various purposes. When received, Ron will contact Robin for help in setting it up and obtaining the ALSA password for it. By doing so, ALSA would reduce the Office communications cost by about 50% in the first few months and even more later.

Vern has discovered a \$1,000 computer was purchased by ALSA in 2012. Who has this computer and for what is it used? Was it assigned to the Grand National?

Also, in 2015, ALSA paid \$519 for another new computer. Who has that computer and for what is it used?

ALSA paid \$75 for Microsoft Office for installation on the Office computer effort to solve the email problems experienced last summer. Vern believes this expense was wrongly attributed to ALSA and should be an expense by Robin according to her contract.

Further discussion centered on expenses in general, which have climbed in recent years while at the same time revenues have decreased, making more changes necessary in the future. An effort must be put forth by the Office and the Membership committee to generate new ALSA participants and a close examination of show expenses where ALSA is the sponsor needs to be done.

Some of these expenses are a monthly contract with Constant Contact for \$45.00. For what is this used? Bill is to ask Robin to see if the price of this contract can be reduced OR a change to using Outlook can be done for general communication purposes.

Vern departed the conference call at 8:16 p.m.

Motion to approve the Treasurer's report for November, 2018 as presented. Motion by Ron. Seconded by Lauren. Motion unanimously passed.

Complete financial statements follow the end of this meeting's report.

By-laws and Standing Rules - Chair: Lougene Baird, Liaison: Bill

At the Annual Meeting it was asked that the Board consider an addition to the bylaw ballot set for early 2019 that would disallow a member from running for the Board if that person had been previously removed from the board. Several other members agreed, and one member suggested an attorney review the idea.

The Committee presents for your review the following change. Additional words are below in *italics and bold.*

ARTICLE III. Board of Directors Section 8. Resignation and Removal

...........A Board member may be censured, suspended or ejected for unauthorized activity by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. <u>Such member shall be permanently barred from serving on the Board.</u>

If this change is presented for approval, other areas in the bylaws would also be changed such as Article II, Section 6. Member in Good Standing (definition), Article III, Section 2 Eligibility to serve on the ALSA Board and re-lettering the subpoints of Article III Section 8.

Please discuss and/or approve or modify.

No report received. There was significant discussion as to the appropriateness of the first paragraph of the welcoming statement in the Grand National program. It was, in view of the Board's effort to increase attendance, viewed with some disappointment.

Concern was expressed about expenses that cost ALSA monies and had not been approved prior to their incurrence. Written contracts need to be used for expenses, so that they can be monitored, controlled, and contained.

The Bylaws require the Board to have an Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors. Traditionally, this meeting has been held at the Grand National Show.

No Board member was reimbursed for any expenses for this required meeting. Not for their attendance, travel expenses, hotels, meals, or anything else.

The performance committee has discussed and agreed on three separate items: 1. The use of a mini van --- We have agreed that a minivan can be used as long as the llama does not have to turn around inside of the van. So, enter through one door and exit a different one.

2. The use of a llama by more than one youth --- We have discussed and agreed that with the lower number of youth participating in shows, there should be no sharing of llamas for youth entered in junior, intermediate, and/or senior divisions.

3. The use of a training halter, where the chin strap tightens with pressure from the lead rope ----- We have discussed and voted to not allow the use of these halters in the performance ring for showing as they take the free choice away from the llama/alpaca by applying pressure to the animal's face.

After discussion, the following Motion was made:

Motion: Approve a one-time waiver for the National Western Stock Show regarding the use of a mini-van rather than a trailer in performance classes, adopt the other recommendations of the Performance committee as presented. Motion by Cathie. Seconded by Carol. Motion passed.

Such changes make them binding on all shows and the Handbook committee should include them in the Handbook.

ALSA Annual Meeting Minutes October 27, 2018

Call to Order: 8:13 a.m. CDT Roll Call:

Quorum: There were 26 members present in person or by proxy. A quorum is ten percent or more of the members in good standing. A quorum was not present.

I. Review, correct if necessary, and approve the Minutes of the 2017 Annual Meeting.

Motion: Approve the Minutes of the 2017 Annual Meeting. Motion by Marcie Agnew. Seconded by Cynthia Ernest. Motion unanimously passed.

II. Office Report:

Robin said there was no change from her October 9, 2018 report.

III. Treasurer's Report:

Vern Wright, Treasurer, reported revenues from all categories were lower in 2018 when compared with 2017. Cash balances are about \$32,000 less than they were a year ago. He expressed optimism that if expenses can be controlled, ALSA will lose only about \$12,000 in 2018 compared to \$17,000 in 2017. He pointed out ALSA has less money in the bank than at any other time.

IV. New Business:

A discussion was had regarding changing the Bylaws so that new Boards of Directors would take office earlier than July 1st. This would mean moving the election process to the Fall and new directors assuming office in January. The purpose behind such a change would be so a Board would have better input and control over the year's events, schedule, and expenses.

Judy Glaser pointed out a series of E-Blasts should be done to continue educating members as to why changes are being made to the voting process.

She further pointed out that new Boards taking office earlier in the year would lead to greater efficiencies in operations. Lauren Wright mentioned this change would help eliminate the chaos that is inherited by a new Board.

Marcie Agnew recommended new verbiage in the Standing Rules or Bylaws to the effect that people who are rejected from the Board are barred from running for the Board in the future.

Larry Lewellyn asked what the cost would be to take the Standing Rules out of the Handbook. He further stated it was admirable of the Board to take care of the financial situation.

Bill Feick pointed out the Board is NOT ALSA, the MEMBERS are.

Marcie Agnew suggested one way to save expenses would be to reduce the number of ribbons awarded. Judy Glaser followed up on this suggestion by saying that "we have spread ourselves so thin, we give ribbons for everything."

Vern said he would look at the possibility of getting a volume discount on ribbons by, for example, ordering all the regional ribbons from a single source.

Deb Yeagle mentioned her idea that ALSA should investigate advertising as a method of getting new members.

Member Cathy Curtis pointed out they cannot afford to go to AOA shows as they are so expensive and that ALSA should look at promoting more alpaca owners into becoming ALSA members.

Marcie Agnew thanked the Board for its efforts in reducing to cost of the Grand National Show this year.

Steve Auld said he was hearing from folks that they don't want to travel to shows unless they are double shows.

Tammy Lash suggested creating some sort of discount for purchasing ALSA numbers in greater amounts, for example, one free number with the purchase of three.

Motion: Adjourn the Annual Meeting. Motion by Jim Rudibaugh. Seconded by Steve Auld. Motion unanimously passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Vern gave an update on the financial situation of the organization, specifically focusing on the present Grand National show. As of today, the Grand National expenses totaled \$10,885, including expenses related to the T-shirts for sale. Receipts presently total \$12,000, with another \$6,000 or so in credit cards to be processed. Vern estimated when sponsorships, dinner receipts, straw sales and other small items are processed, total receipts should be about \$21,000 and total expenses will approximate \$17,000. If these are the final results, the Grand National will have been a profitable show and not represent a drain on cash savings.

According to Vern, the checking account totals approximately \$17,000 and ALSA has plus or minus \$30,000 in savings.

Regional show revenues reported thus far are in the range of \$6,000 to \$7,000 compared to approximately \$15,000 in 2017.

2017 total revenues about \$94,000 and total expenses were about \$111,000 and office expenses in 2017 were \$52,914 with \$45,000 contract labor and Internet/telephone expenses \$3,831. The 2017 loss was about \$17,000.

New Business:

A. Discussion then was had regarding a request from Harvey Pool to sponsor a lama show having a silky llama division. This would be a one-time event, which could serve as a test marketing of the concept of adding a silky division for llamas in ALSA shows.

Motion: Allow a one-time silky division at the 2019 North American Livestock Exposition. Motion by Deb. Seconded by Carol. Motion passed unanimously.

- **B.** It was brought to the Board's attention there is no limit to how many youth can share the same llama in the same youth classes. This was discussed at length, with the decision to refer the matter to the proper committees to review and make recommendations as to how such a situation should be handled.
- **C.** Lougene Baird, Chair of the Bylaws and Standing Rules Committee and the Election Committee was present and asked to discuss a proposed change in the Bylaws regarding when elections are held and when new Board members would take office.

A change such as this is needed so that future Boards assume office much earlier in the year and have more direct contact and decision-making ability over events and shows rather than inheriting budgets and scheduled arranged by the previous Board. The full new Board would be able to budget for the coming year using the previous year's Journal entries, Profit and Loss and Balance Sheet to make more educated decisions. In addition, Committee Chairs may be confirmed at the beginning of the year.

Lougene recommended the following suggestions to the election and other aspects of the Bylaws and associated Standing Rules to facilitate Boards taking office earlier than the current July 1st date:

1.) Conduct a Bylaws ballot in the first quarter of 2019 to modify the election process with wording similar to: the election process begins with the Day of Record at September 1st, allowing members who join during the show season to announce their candidacy and or vote. Election voting would be approximately October 1st and end October 15th with results announced shortly thereafter. New Board members would be able to participate as non-voting members of the Board in November and December, to become familiar with items, and officially take office January 1st.

- 2.) Since two current Board members leave office June 30, for 2019, the out-going President becomes Past President and attends Board meetings in an advisory non-voting capacity. A resolution is needed to make this official.
- 3.) In future years, the out-going President remains on the Board until the next election as Past President, a non-voting advisory position.

The Board requested that Lougene address the general meeting of members tomorrow and explain this proposal so that a broad range of members would be aware of it and could offer suggestions or advice concerning it.

The next regular Board meeting will be November 13, 2018.

Motion: Adjourn the meeting. Motion by Debbie. Seconded by Carol. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 9:30 a.m. CDT.

I. Office Manager's Report:

BOD Meeting - Office Report Tuesday, October 9, 2018

1. Memberships

As of October 3, 2018, we currently have 220 regular members. This is an increase from last month of 6. Last year at this time we had 245 regular members. We currently have 192 youth signed up. This is an increase from last month of 4. Last year at this time we had 21 1 youth. We have 114 LIFE Members. Last year at this time we had 113 LIFE members. We have 53 Judges. The Office Manager and the Treasurer then departed the conference call.

- I. Old Business:
 - A. Grand National

The Board had a discussion regarding the much increased number of entries being received for this year's Grand National show. Considerable pleasure was expressed, especially in view of negativity being evinced by some members who, it is believed, did not understand the necessity of making changes to the Grand National format in order to keep it a viable event.

The superintendent had informed the President that, due to the mail holiday, she understood more entries were still coming. The Board discussed that a further extension of the deadline should be considered. To wit:

Motion: Extend the deadline for entries for the 2018 Grand National show to October 19th. Motioned by Ron. Seconded by Cathie. Motion unanimously passed.

II.New Business:

A. Lowering the cost of filing a protest. The current cost is \$250 and may discourage people from filing what would be rightful protests. A suggestion has been made to lower the cost to a more reasonable number. Changing this fee — will it require action by the Protest Committee or a change to the Bylaws and/or Standing Rules? Certainly Handbook information will need to be updated.

This matter received considerable discussion revolving around the possibility that a significant lowering of the protest fee would likely result in frivolous protests as well as nitpicky items unworthy of the committee's time being spent on more important and significant matters of concern. Yet it was determined that a lowering of the fee would be appropriate to encourage members to bring matters that should be considered by the committee to the committee. A motion was then made, to wit:

Motion: Reduce the fee for filing a protest from its current level of \$250.00 to \$200.00. Motion by Deb. Seconded by Lauren. Motion unanimously passed.

B. Discussion of a possible Bylaw change to seat Boards earlier in the year so a new Board can be more actively involved in the planning of the year's events and procedures. See the committee report below for additional information and items for discussion.

Members of the Board discussed this possible change, which also would require editing of the Standing Rules and a vote of the membership. It was expressed that

this Board, which took office in July, had no part in the planning process for events such as the Grand National show. All members felt that an incoming Board should have more time and "say-so" in the way events that would be under its legacy should be planned, managed, and executed. After unanimous discussion and approval, the following motion was adopted.

Motion: Put before the membership Bylaw changes such that the membership votes earlier in the year for Board of Director members. This membership vote would also include changing the date a new Board takes office to facilitate that Board being involved in planning the Grand National show and other events throughout the year. Motion by Deb. Seconded by Ron. Motion unanimously passed.

C. Discussion concerning rotation of Board terms so that several Board members are elected each year. Right now, next year there will be two positions open, and in 2020 five positions open. See the Bylaws, Article III — Board of Directors, Section 5. Term and Tenure for complete information about this matter.

This matter arose due to Board vacancies and lack of Board candidates over the paste years. It has concerned this Board immensely as 5 of its 7 members are new, having only taken office in July. The members recognize that a reestablishment of the rotate of membership would benefit not only incoming Boards but also the membership by having experienced and history knowledgable members in place. Deb suggested that Carol and Ron since they were the newest members of the Board agree to accepting two-year terms rather than three-year terms, which would re-stablish the rotation very easily. Carol and Ron readily agreed to two-year terms.

D. A suggestion has been received that the Bylaws no longer need to be printed in the Handbook. In the beginning, they were since most people did not have computers or an internet. Nowadays, they could be on the website where everyone can access them, saving ALSA money by not printing them in the Handbook. People then can print them out if they care to do so.

Discussion recognized that the times have changed since the Bylaws were first put into the Handbook to fill some pages and the facts were that hardly anyone owned a computer or had internet access. A suggestion was made that the entire Handbook should not be printed, thereby saving nearly \$4,000.00 annually in expenses. Discussion of this possibility revolved around it being available on the website where members could print out their own copy. Several judges pointed out that they needed the Handbook in its convenience form at shows, preferring to use the printed version rather than accessing it on a tablet or other device. A decision was made, asking the President to contact the Handbook Chair, Adryce Mathisen, and ask her to eliminate both the Bylaws/Standing Rules and Life Member list from the Handbook. These items henceforth will be listed on the website.

E. The ALSA website has some technical problems. These range from members not being able to access parts of it to possible contamination by some means. The Board recognized this needs to be corrected for the benefit of members as well as ALSA's public image. Therefore,

Motion: Engage Dot Tech. to examine the website and submit an estimate to correct its deficiencies and determine what other matters need to be corrected. Motion by Deb. Seconded by Ron. Motion unanimously passed.

F. Changes have been proposed regarding Part O — Fleece in the Handbook. These had been submitted to the Board earlier. They were discussed and accepted.

Motion: Accept changes to the Handbook, Part O — Fleeces as proposed. Motion by Ron. Seconded by Deb. Motion unanimously passed.

IV. Committee Reports:

Alpaca - Chair: Mary Reed, Liaison: Deb

No report submitted.

By-laws and Standing Rules — Chair: Lougene Baird, Liaison: Bill

A request from the ALSA Board was received by this committee to research and comment on Bylaw changes required to seat a new Board early in the year rather than when the year is half over. As an example, the Committee chose early March to complete voting and the new Board to be seated by the second Tuesday in March regular meeting. The required changes are:

Article III Section 5. Term and Tenure (c) — The term of office shall begin July* <u>the 2 nd</u> <u>Tuesday of March</u> following the election.

Article III Section 6. Election (b) — Becoming a declared Candidate. Between January 1 and Apprl

January 15, a current member whose membership is in good standing may declare themselves a Candidate.

Article III Section 6. (c) — Declared Candidates must notify the Election Committee of their intention to be placed on the ballot by e-mail or U.S. Postal Service by ApFW4 January 15.

The amendment of the Association Bylaws requires approval by a majority of the Board of Directors and a two-thirds vote of memberships voting. (Article V Amendments Section I. (b)).

Should the Board and membership approve these or other changes, this committee will edit the Standing Rules to compliment the Bylaw changes and submit to the Board for approval and posting.

Addendum II

ALPACA AND LLAMA SHOW ASSOCIATION, INC. STANDING RULES

(Revised XXXXXXXXXXX pending additional BOD changes

ARTICLE I ALSA Board of Directors

Section 1. Compensation

Directors shall be entitled to receive their actual, necessary expenses in attending meetings of the Board of Directors. Directors who are also officers or employees of the corporation and who are compensated as such shall receive no compensation as Directors. Other Directors shall receive such compensation as may be established by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Employees

The Board of Directors may by resolution authorize one or more employees or independent contractor to perform under the direction of the Board of Directors any duties that may be necessary for conducting the business of the corporation.

Section 3. Internal Controls

(a) All ALSA accounts must be in the name of the association – ALSA.

(b) The Executive Secretary will always keep the President and Secretary updated as to the account numbers, usernames and passwords of all ALSA accounts. Including, but not limited to:

- a. Carbonite computer back-up system
- b. All bank accounts
- c. alsashow.org website
- d. alsashow.net website
- e. Constant Contact

f. Secure server for credit cards g. ALSA credit card

(c) The President will always maintain an up-to-date quarterly copy of the database program and database files, and the ALSA membership list as supplied by Executive Secretary. Also, yearly copy of the workable current Handbook.

Section4. Policies and Workings of the BOD

(a) All corrections, additions, and approvals of the minutes must be made within 10 days. Afterdays without response, the minutes will be posted as written.

(b) Information from a BOD meeting is not to be released until the minutes are approved and posted. "If a committee needs to know information from the BOD meeting before the minutes are posted, the liaison needs to ask BOD permission." (minutes 2-8-2010)

(c) Email motions need a second to be attached to the minutes. (minutes 12-2009)

(d) BOD members must respond to all email motions that have been made within 72-hours unless circumstances dictate immediate action and shorter approval. Once a positive majority of the members vote, the vote stands with or without the remainder of the BOD voting. Ignoring or not

BOD members vote, the vote stands with or without the remainder of the BOD voting. Ignoring or not voting for an email motion will be considered an abstention. (minutes 3/12/2010) (Change to Minutes 3/12/2013)

 (e) Letters, emails, etc. sent to the ALSA Board of Directors from members that include copies to other ALSA members and/or other interested parties will not be answered by the Board. The Board's position is that such letters are more of a public statement of a political position rather an inquiry of the Board. (minutes 2-12-2010)

Section 5. Communications

(a) The President will acknowledge receipt of all communications addressed to the Board of Directors with a confirmation by email, phone, or mail within 48 hours.

b) The President and/or any BOD Member must forward, in a timely manner, all communications and letters addressed to all BOD members for review a minimum of seven (7) days before the BOD meeting. If for some reason said submission cannot be disseminated to remaining board members a minimum of seven (7) days prior to a board meeting and it is not something that will adversely affect the financial wellbeing of the organization, then any votes will be tabled until a future meeting.

(c) Committee reports and Office report should be submitted in a word document form. If Committee reports and Office report are not received by seven (7) days prior to the scheduled meeting; the BOD will decide if to be acted on immediately or tabled and added to the Agenda of the following meeting.

(d) All letters, replies, and communications sent out by the President and/or any BOD Member must first be reviewed and approved by the BOD.

Section 6. BOD Conduct

(a) Items of expected behaviors of BOD members are: respect, confidentiality, responsibility of a timely response, opportunity of opinion on all issues, avoidance of conflict of interest. Threatening and/or or slanderous emails to other BOD members are not acceptable. (minutes 1-16-08)

(b) It is not appropriate for BOD members to post on an internet chat list since it could easily represent only a personal opinion or a personal agenda and not the opinion of the ALSA BOD. (minutes 10-23-08)

ARTICLE II FINANCIALS

Section 1. Segregation of Duties

No financial transaction is to be handled by only one person from beginning to end. It is necessary that the person who signs the checks for ALSA not be the bookkeeper or the person who receives and deposits the monies.

(a) The Office Secretary is to write checks using Quick Books. All checks shall be sent to the ALSA Treasurer, accompanied by invoices for signature and mailing. (minutes 2-26-08)

(b) All checks in the amount of \$1500 or over must be approved by the BOD prior to signing. (minutes 2-26-08)

(c) A line-item financial report will be provided to the BOD each month. (minutes 12-9-08)

(d) All bank accounts will include the names of the ALSA President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. Financial Requests

All requests for financial requests must be accompanied by a statement of the complete budget showing how the funds will be handled. (minutes May, 2008)

ARTICLE III Election

Section 1: Election

(a) The Day of Record shall be set by the Election Committee. The Day of Record is the last day
person may pay dues and become a member in good standing as part of the qualifications to
participate in the election process.

(b) Determination of Members in good standing shall be as described in the:

- 1. ALSA Bylaws, ARTICLE II, Section 5, Voting in its entirety,
- 2. Article II, Section 6, Member in Good Standing in its entirety, and
- 3. Article III, Board of Directors, Section 2. Eligibility in its entirety.

(c) The Treasurer and Office Manager shall reconcile the list of members using the Day of Record to create an up-to-date list to present to the Board of Directors for approval. The members on the Board approved list will be deemed in good standing and may participate in the election process.

(d) Using the list of members in good standing, the Election Committee shall determine the existence of a quorum, hear and determine all challenges and questions in any way arising in connection with the right to vote.

(e) Candidate Statement guidelines.

ballot

- 1. Must be members in good standing of the Association as of the Day of Record.
- 2. Declare themselves a candidate between January 1 and April 1 by giving notice to the Election Committee.
- 3. Submit the final version of their Statement of Candidacy and photo to the Election Committee before 12:00 noon April 30 CST.
- 4. In additional, other instructions will be given to candidates following their declaration to assist in the writing their Statement.
- Should a candidate not submit a Statement by the deadline, his/her name will be placed on the ballot and name only will be placed on the Statement of Candidacy.
- 6. Should a candidate choose to not run for election, the member shall notify the Election Committee by email of his/her decision by 12:00 noon April 30 CDT.
- 7. The format of the Statement of Candidacy, its distribution to the membership and shall be established by the Election Committee.

(f) The ALSA Bylaws allow for the voting process to be completed by either electronic voting or written mail-in ballots but not a combination of both within the same election. The procedure shall be as follows.

(g) Electronic Ballot Election. Notification of electronic balloting along with instructions for the balloting process will be sent via e-mail to all members in good standing. It is the responsibility of each member to inform the ALSA office of his/her correct and current e-mail address. Statements of Candidacy will be emailed to each member during the first week of May. The time period to begin and end voting will be between, but not limited to, May 25 and June 5 of the election year. The agency will have the vote tally available within 24-hours for the Election Committee after the election process is complete.

(h) Written Ballots Election. Notification that written ballots will be sent via USPS will be communicated via email to all members in good standing. Written ballots will be mailed to all members in good standing between May 1 and the end of the second week of May. All written ballots must be received by mail or fax by the tallying group by June 5. Ballot envelopes must include a member's ALSA number and all information must be complete and legible for verification

of membership. The tallying agency will verify all information on the return envelope and tally the ballots. Ballot envelopes without complete information will be deemed spoiled. The results will be reported to the Election Committee within 24 hours after completion of the tally.

(i) Regardless of the type of election process (electronic or written), upon notification of the election results, the Election Committee will then inform its Board Liaison of the results. The Board Liaison will then notify the highest member of the Board of Directors whose position is not on the ballot. This individual will verbally advise all candidates of the election results (and only the candidates). This individual will then advise the Election Committee that the candidates have been notified. The Election Committee will forward the results to the webmaster for general publication on the ALSA Website and/or e-mail notification to the membership.

(j) Challenges – All challenges regarding the voting must be received by the Election Chair by 12 PM Noon CDT June 30. All challenges must contain the name, address, ALSA number, and signature of the challenger. All written ballots will be retained by the Election Committee until midnight July 1, after which they will be destroyed. If challenges are issued, the ballots will be preserved until said challenge is acknowledged as resolved by the Board of Directors, at which point they will be destroyed.

(k) A Director may be subject to a recall vote by a signed petition of at least twenty five percent (25%) of the membership who were members in good standing as of the Day of Record, followed by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of a quorum of the membership (as described in ALSA Bylaws Article II – Membership, Section 4. Quorum).

ARTICLE IV

Youth Scholarship

Youth ALSA members who are graduating High School Seniors in the current year may apply for one of two scholarships from the ALSA Memorial Youth Scholarship Fund. These scholarships will be recognized prior to the ALSA Grand National Championship Show held each fall. The ALSA Memorial Youth Scholarship Fund will operate as follows:

Section 1 – Requirements

1. Applications may be sent to the committee by U. S. Mail.

2. All applications, recommendation letters, and responses MUST be postmarked date stamped by March 15th. Any applications without that postmark or date stamp will not be considered.

3. Applicants must fill out the scholarship application completely and it must accompany the responses and recommendation letters in order to be considered for the scholarship.

4. The order of the packet shall be:

- A. Application form
- B. Checklist and confirmation page
- C. Response questions

- D. Recommendation letters
- E. All applicants must include 2 letters of reference with this application from the following (excluding relatives):
 - 1. an individual in your educational background
 - 2. An individual familiar with your llama-related events.

F. High School Transcript must be included. Applicants must submit a short article about themselves and send a current picture with article. This complete packet should be mailed to the Scholarship Committee Chairperson.

5. Applicants will receive an email within 5 days confirming that their complete application has been received.

6. Applicants who did not meet the above requirements will be notified within 5 days that they will not be considered for the scholarship.

7. All applicants must be a high school senior in preparation of graduation in the year they apply for the ALSA scholarship, a current ALSA Youth member, and no older than 19 years of age at the time of the application.

8. The applicant must plan to attend an accredited college or university within a year of application.

9. Scholarship winners will be notified by May 15th.

Section 2 – Selection

The Youth Scholarship Chair shall notify the ALSA President of the Scholarship winners. The ALSA President shall notify the scholarship winners in writing, by mail or email, no later than May 15. Scholarship funds will be directed directly to the College or University at the time that fees are due. Winners will have two (2) years after high school to have funds distributed to the College or University of their choice. In order to protect all involved, the contents of applications may not be printed in any publication. Applicants who do win and are planning to attend the Grand National Show will be expected to attend the Opening Ceremony so that they may be recognized. Applicants with questions are to contact the ALSA Youth Scholarship chairperson. Questions asked by parents will NOT be accepted or answered.

Section 3 – Funding

(a) A memorial website page will be kept for donations made in remembrance of an ALSA member. Donations will go into the Youth Memorial Scholarship Fund. (minutes 12-9-08)
 (b) A Silent Auction will be held annually by the Youth Committee at the Grand National Show.

Proceeds will go to the Youth Memorial Scholarship Fund.

ARTICLE V Records

Section 1. Corporate Book, Points, Judges

The following records must be kept by the Alpaca and Llama Show Association, Inc:

(a) A corporate book that contains the bylaws and minutes of all the corporate meetings. Plus it must retain copies of the annual reports which include the annual tax or information returns filed

with the federal government.

- (b) A list of all show points earned by show llamas and alpacas.
- (c) A list of all show points earned by youth members.
- (d) A list of all qualified ALSA sanctioned Judges and Apprentice Judges.
- (e) A list of all members in good standing

Stalling, Tack Areas & Farm Displays

All stalling will be pre-assigned by the stalling crew. All stalls are 10' X 10' horse stalls. No more than two adult llamas, 3 juvenile llamas or 3 alpacas are permitted in each stall. Stalls may also be purchased as farm display spaces for \$40.00 per stall however stall fronts cannot be removed. Barn aisles must be kept open at all times to permit dust control. Stalls for tack may be purchased at the same price-\$40.00 per stall.

THE STALLS MAY NOT BE USED FOR BREEDING. There is no cooking or heaters allowed in the stalls.

If you are bringing a single animal and need a stalling companion, you may contact Glenna Overmiller for any stalling information.

Facility Policy on Dogs:

The show superintendent must be notified if you are planning on bringing a dog to Grand Nationals. There will be no dogs allowed in the arena area.

Bedding

All stall floors are concrete. **There will be no bedding provided.** You will need to bring your own mats or carpeting. You may bring cardboard, Equine Fresh Pellets, and straw. Shredded Paper is **NOT** allowed.

Grooming

There are wash racks. Blowing may be done in the building but away from the stalling area and only in those designated areas.

Water & Electric

Both water and electric are available in the barns. Exhibitors are responsible for bringing their own extension cords.

Performance Classes

All Youth Performance classes will start Friday morning after Opening Ceremonies. All 3 courses will run simultaneously. Novice, Advanced, and Masters will run all 3 courses simultaneously following the youth. Performance walk-thru will take priority over other classes and courses held open as necessary to insure no exhibitor misses a class.

Halter Classes

Each llama must be entered in its appropriate age and wool division at the time of the ALSA Grand National. On a llama's date of birth, the llama moves up to the older

class. All four wool divisions will be included in the ALSA Grand National Show. If you showed at a show where wool divisions were combined (e.g., Light/Medium or Medium/Heavy), you must choose the correct wool division for the ALSA Grand Nationals.

The Alpaca Halter will be conducted as a Level I Show. Please review Part K of the ALSA Handbook for rules relating to Alpaca Halter Classes and contact the Grand National Committee if you have any questions.

New Business:

I. Grand National:

Glenna Overmiller joined the meeting to discuss the 2018 Grand National Show and the subsequent discussion included the following information and aspects of the show:

- A. Grand National Committee members: Joy Pedroni (707-447-5046) Judy Glaser (303-646-6311 Sandy Auld (319-389-8254 Robin Turell (281-516-1442) Cathie Kindler (419-610-1748) Glenna Overmiller (785-346-4365)
- **B.** The Grand National Committee is working to ensure that everyone attending the ALSA Grand National has a good time. The committee is organizing the performance, data entry, fleece, schedule, and so forth to stay within a budget and at least financially break-even.
- **C.** The Grand National committee does not enter into binding contracts. A list of Judges is presented to the committee and it sends its choice of Judges to the ALSA Board of Directors, which then approves or disapproves the Judges for the Grand National. When the judges are approved, then Glenna contacts Robin to send the Judges contracts.
- D. It was decided by a previous ALSA Board to reimburse the performance coordinator for the fuel cost to transport the obstacles to the Grand Nationals. Joy Pedroni has worked very hard to have "National quality" performance courses for the show. The Pedronis have made the obstacles at their own expense and are only asking for fuel to get them here. Fuel receipts will be sent to the ALSA Treasurer for reimbursement. The estimated fuel cost is \$1,500.00.
- **E.** The booth cost for a vendor at the Grand National is \$120.00. The ALSA Office has contracts available for vendors.
- **F.** Obstacles are being built and managed by the Pedronis -707-447-5046
- **G.** Ring Stewards and gate keepers No volunteers have come forth for these positions yet. We need several persons for each position.

- **H.** The Saturday evening dinner is being managed by Jessica Tagtmeyer-785-346-4086.
- I. No social programs are planned at this time.
- J. Welcoming of exhibitors, their stall assignments, and set-up of the show will be handled by Glenna and her family. Volunteers to help with these show aspects are needed and VERY appreciated! Jens Rudibaugh and Marci Saska-Agnew are decorating the arena and other areas.
- **K.** Prairie Vista Veterinary Hospital is the veterinarian service on call. They do not charge us a retainer fee; the only fee is if they are called to the facility. That fee will be at the exhibitor's expense.
- L. Clerking will be handled by Sandy Auld, who has a copy of the 3-Judge system and has familiarized herself with it. Sandy has been clerking shows for quite some time and understands the process.
- M. Announcing-Steve Auld will again be the announcer.
- **N.** Anticipated income:

- **O.** Judges' fees and expenses are estimated at \$5,249.00.
- **P.** Facility not discussed pending amount.
- Q. Security is estimated to cost \$150.00 for 3 nights and will be provided by John Mendenhall. Security is from 12:00 midnight to 6:00 A.M, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.
- **R.** Obstacles are being brought from California by the Pedronis.
- Silent auction A new chair to handle this part of the show is needed as Hunter is too close to her due date to travel. Proceeds of the auction largely will be used to offset show expenses, with a portion going to the Youth Scholarship Fund.
- **T.** Regarding the annual raffle, there needs to either be many more items to raffle, or limitation placed on the number of items. Several exciting and significant prizes need to be obtained to increase the interest in the raffle.
- **U.** Annual meeting -The meeting will be held Saturday morning during the same time that Youth Judging is underway. This will create a more smooth-running show and help facilitate the judging of that portion of the show.
- V. A meeting room costs \$200.00 (last year the cost was \$500.00) we can use this building for the Judges' meeting, the annual meeting and the dinner. The \$200.00 is for the entire week-end.
- **W.** Ribbons will cost approximately \$3, 912.00 for this year's show. The order has been placed with Hodges. Trophies are being provided by Henry Rivera and will be delivered directly to the show.
- **X.** E-Blasts promoting the show are being sent every two weeks to ALSA members.

II. ALSA T-shirt Proposal and other Promotional Items.

At 7:55 p.m. CDT, Ruby Herron joined in the meeting to explain the planned power point presentation, a great fund raiser. Show sponsors will get from 4 photos to 20 photos on this constantly changing presentation, depending on the level of their sponsorship.

Show sponsors are needed as their donations are one of the major sources of revenues to cover show expenses.

Deb Yeagle has already signed up at the \$250.00 level.

Sponsorship levels range from \$25.00, \$50.00, \$100.00, \$150.00, \$250.00, and \$500.00 to \$1,000.00, \$2,500.00, and \$5,000.00.

This year, ALSA will manage a booth selling ALSA-branded T-shirts, hoodies, and canvas tote bags. In previous years, an outside vendor (who paid nothing to ALSA) was the party selling these products. The T-shirts, hoodies, and canvas bags will have great emblems, become valued collectors' items, and sell very well.

ALSA Handbook PART B. Committees

Section 1. General Rules

A. Committees

1. All committees exist at the discretion of the Board, are responsible to advise and report to the Board, and must not act independently of the Board.

B. Committee Membership

1. All committees should consist of a minimum of two and a maximum of seven voting ALSA members in addition to non-voting Board Liaison.

2. All committee members will serve for a period of one year to coincide with the installment of the new Board with the exception of Grand National, and Regional Championship Committees, whose terms will begin December 1.

3. All committee chairpersons will be selected by the Board

of Directors. Committee members will be selected by the

Committee Chairperson and must be approved by the Board of Directors.

C. Committee Responsibilities

1. Recommendations from each committee will be submitted in writing to the ALSA Board of Directors. The ALSA Board of Directors may either adopt or reject these written recommendations.

2. The deadline for Committees to submit any proposed Handbook

changes to the Handbook Committee will be

October 31of each year. The Handbook Committee will submit all proposed Handbook changes to the Board of

Directors on or before November 30 with approved changes to take effect on January 1 of the following year.

3. Once the Handbook has been printed and distributed, no other changes will take effect until the next printing.

Section 2. Specific Committee Requirements

A. Alpaca Committee

Purpose:

The committee shall make recommendations to the ALSA Board of Directors regarding alpaca show classes, alpaca class descriptions and criteria, alpaca award or points system, training of alpaca Judges, and minimum requirements for approved alpaca shows. The committee will work with the Judges and Fleece Committees to schedule and organize judging clinics and assist in the training of alpaca judges.

B. Committees

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B. Election and Committee

1. Members:

a. Committee members may not be candidates for office while serving on the committee.

2. Purpose:

a. To organize and implement General and Special elections in accordance with the current bylaws and standing rules.

C. Ethics Committee

1. Members:

Members should be thoroughly familiar with the current edition of the ALSA Handbook, particularly the sections on Ethics and Violations and Protests.

2. Purpose:

a. Establish ethics guidelines for Show Management, Owners and Breeders, Exhibitors, and Judges.

b. To take insights and input from the Protest Committee and written protest letters, "test" them against existing guidelines, and upgrade them as necessary for ALSA Handbook revisions.

D. Finance and Budget Committee

1. Members

a. Committee members should have experience in financial issues.

2. Purpose

a. Members are to review the financials and make suggestions on entries and ways to display the financials. b. Look into investment.

c. Stay in contact with the Treasurer and office to help make the best business decisions for ALSA.

E. Fleece Committee

1. Members

a. Members should be thoroughly familiar with the current edition of the ALSA Handbook and with Ilama fiber and/ or alpaca fiber.

b. Committee members are selected by the Chairperson of the Committee

c. One member must be a certified ALSA Llama Fleece Judge.2. Purpose

a. The committee shall make recommendations to the ALSA Board of Directors regarding Ilama/alpaca fleece shows, Ilama/alpaca fleece class descriptions and criteria, Ilama/ alpaca fleece award or points system, training of Ilama/ alpaca fleece Judges, and minimum requirements for approved Ilama/alpaca fleece shows. The committee will work with the Alpaca and Judges Committees to schedule 2017 ALSA Handbook, Rev 0117 B-3

and organize judging clinics and assist in the training of lama/alpaca fleece judges.

F. Grand National Committee

1. Members

a. Members should be from different parts of the country to assist in providing a national perspective.

b. Standing members of the Committee are:

- 1. ALSA Executive Secretary
- 2. ALSA Treasurer
- 3. ALSA Show Committee Chairperson

4. ALSA Regional Championship Committee

Chairperson

c.The Grand National Chairperson may add additional members as needed to be approved by the Board of Directors.

d. The Grand National Committee should consist of:

1. The Grand National Committee Chairperson /Superintendent

- 2. The Grand National Halter Coordinator
- 3. The Grand National Performance Coordinator
- 4. The Grand National Fleece Coordinator

e. All Grand National Coordinators report to the Grand

National Show Superintendent. Each Grand National Coordinator may appoint subcommittee members to

achieve their tasks in respective divisions.

2. Purpose:

Responsible for assisting the Grand National Show Superintendent with the venue, planning and running of the annual ALSA Grand National Show.

G. Handbook Committee

1. Members

a. Members should be thoroughly familiar with the current edition of the ALSA Handbook.

b. Whenever possible, committee members should have proofreading, editorial and/or writing skills.

2. Purpose

a. Responsible for ongoing proofreading and correcting of Handbook errors including grammar, spelling, typographical errors, clarity and format.

b. Responsible for carrying out Board directives for accurately transcribing and appropriately placing official rule changes, additions and deletions within time lines required by the Board of Directors.

c. Responsible for working with all other Committees

B. Committees

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throughout the year on any proposed rule changes and reviewing such changes to confirm they do not conflict with other sections of the Handbook. Also responsible for suggesting changes to make the Handbook concise, consistent and user friendly.

H. Judges' Committee

1. Members

a. All members must be certified ALSA Judges

b. Members should include a representative from the Alpaca Committee and the Fleece Committee.

c. The Chairperson of the Judges' Committee shall be elected by ALSA judges and apprentices in good standing, with the election to be held in accordance with Article III, Section 2 of the Standing Rules.

2. Purpose

a. Responsible for planning, organizing, developing, administrating and evaluating all aspects of the Judges' program including, but not limited to: curriculum, scheduling of Judges' and show clinics, and certification and evaluation of Judges.

b. Responsible for clinic instructors' training and recommendations to the Board for approval of instructors.

c. Will work with Alpaca and Fleece Committees to schedule and organize judging clinics

d. Responsible for evaluating and developing judging criteria for all ALSA approved classes and optional classes as described in the ALSA Handbook.

e. Responsible for reviewing and making recommendations to the Board regarding any suggested changes to the overall show format which may affect the judging process and responsibilities.

I. Membership Committee

1. Members

a. Members are selected by the chairperson from persons committed to making a positive contribution to the ALSA membership.

b. The committee members will represent as many ALSA regions as possible.

2. Purpose

a. Responsible for promoting membership in ALSA.

b. To promote ALSA at shows, meetings and other camelid functions within their Regions.

c. Responsible to the Board of Directors for any tasks as assigned in their functional area.

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J. Performance Committee

1. Members

a. An effort shall be made to have committee members from various regions of the country with experience showing in llama and/or alpaca performance classes and/or show management experience.

b. One member must be a certified ALSA Judge.

2. Purpose

a. Make recommendations to the Board and other appropriate committees regarding approved performance classes, optional performance classes and future considerations

pertaining to the above.

K. Protest Committee

1. Members. The committee shall not include a current Board member. The committee will consist of:

- a. A past Board Member.
- b. Chairperson of the Judges' Committee
- c. Chairperson of the Ethics Committee
- d. Chairperson of the Policy and Planning Committee
- e. A Senior Judge
- f. An exhibitor
- g. An experienced Show Superintendent
- 2. Purpose

a. To review all written protests made by exhibitors, breeders, Show Management or Judges and to decide the validity of the protests.

b. To recommend appropriate action as the result of a valid protest.

c. Protests related to Judges are sent to the Judges'

Committee to be placed in the Judges' file following a recommendation of action from the Board of Directors.

L. Publications, Promotion, Marketing and Website Committee

1. Members

a. Members are selected by the Chairperson from persons

interested in representing regions of the membership area. b. Members of the committee should be familiar with the construction of websites.

2. Purpose

a. Coordinate, oversee production and disseminate information for the official ALSA publication, currently known as Showring.

b. Publish and distribute the ALSA Handbook along with the ALSA Office.

a. Members should have experience as Show Management for ALSA sanctioned shows, including Regional and National shows.

b. An effort will be made to have representation from a variety

of ALSA regions.

c. To review show classes, policies, and procedures and make recommendations to the ALSA Board.

2. Purpose

a. To develop and review show packets sent to Show

Superintendents.

b. Educate the superintendents and their crews in proper show management procedures.

c. To review all material received pertaining to ALSA planning and policy and make recommendations in writing to the ALSA Board of Directors.

O. Youth Committee

1. Members

a. Members are selected by the Chairperson from persons with experience working with Youth and showing.

b. One member must be an approved ALSA Judge.

- c. One member must have 4-H/FFA leader experience.
- d. Committee may contain youth representation.

2. Purpose

a. Responsible for planning, developing, administrating and evaluating the Youth Division program.

b. Responsible for evaluation of regulations governing the Youth

program and making recommendations to the Board of Directors.

P. Bylaws and Standing Rules Committee

1. Members: Up to three members will be selected from the membership at large.

2. Purpose: The Committee shall be responsible for maintaining the latest official and correct version of Bylaws and Standing Rules. Most recent copies will be posted on the ALSA website.

a. Bylaws – Bylaw changes must be approved by two-thirds of the memberships voting. Following the approval of any bylaw change, the committee will update the official copy of the bylaws to reflect the exact change. The revised date will be noted on the permanent copy. Old versions retained for historical records for reference only.

b. Standing Rules – Standing rules are of a continuing nature and fall under the hierarchy of the Bylaws. They may be changed by a majority vote of the Board and become effective immediately or when noted. Standing rules are administrative and establish specific procedures and functions.

c. Bylaws and Standing Rules shall compliment complement each other.

Part F. Grand National Section 9. Points and Awards-Grand National Show:

- A. Triple ALSA points will be awarded to participants for placing's earning points.
- B. Other ALSA regular show awards also will be awarded to qualifying participants. Refer to Part I. Section 3 and Part G, Sections 4 & 5.
- C. All Grand Champion and Reserve Champion placements earned at a Grand National

show will count towards the ALSA Champion designation, regardless of the number of entries in the applicable Division.

IV. Request by the Hoosier Llama and Alpaca Association for a decrease in entry fees for the Buckeye Regional Show.

The proposal the HLAA is making is to lower the cost of the Buckeye Regional in an attempt to bring in more entries and have it continue to be a success. The current entry fee of the Buckeye Regional is \$25.00 per class and \$80.00 to enter Halter, Showmanship and Performance classes. We are proposing to leave the per class fee at \$25.00 but lowering the multiple class fee from \$80.00 to \$70.00.

ALSA Judge's Committee Report

June 2018

The committee has been reviewing qualifications for judges to be eligible to accept apprentices and judge Regionals and Nationals.

When the current guidelines were implemented there were still many shows on a yearly basis with many that had at least 50 animals in them, thus allowing our new judges the ability to develop their judging capabilities But times have changed dramatically since that then. Now we are looking at fewer and much smaller shows. The committee wants to be sure that only highly qualified judges are taking apprentices and are available for Regionals and Nationals. We also don't want to have some of our very qualified judges not be eligible to judge a Regional or National show if due to some unforeseen issues they weren't able to judge for a year. Based on this we are presenting the following change to guidelines for approval. If the board accepts this it will immediately be forwarded to the handbook committee.

Motion by Cheryl to table discussion of proposed Handbook revision until the Judge's Committee has followed the proper procedure and sent it to the Handbook Committee. Seconded by Bill and unanimously approved.

Cheryl is asked to remind the Judge's Committee about the procedure for submitting Handbook changes.

Proposed clinics:

A llama halter, performance and youth clinic is in the works for Fall of 2018 to be held on the West Coast. At this time location has not been set but the instructor will be Barb Harris.

An Alpaca halter and fleece clinic has been proposed for January 2019 to be held in Florida at Brenda Crum's ranch. It will be taught by Deb Yeagle. The details are being fleshed out at this time. An option that is being looked at is to offer to judges who only hold Llama Fleece certification to attend the one day portion on alpaca fleece to add alpaca fleece to their fleece designation.

While reviewing board minutes and judge's files dating back to the early 2000 there have been numerous references to combining the Llama fleece and Alpaca fleece under one heading and that would be just Fleece. In this time of smaller shows it might encourage shows to expand their options if fleece judges, across the country, were trained in both alpaca and llama. This clinic option, for our Llama fleece judges, would help ALSA into moving toward a single fleece division.

Cheryl noted that the majority of Llama Fleece Judges who are not also certified to judge alpaca fleece live in states west of the Mississippi and it would be a financial burden for them to have to fly to Florida for a one day clinic. Jim made a suggestion that an alpaca fleece clinic could be held at the Grand National which is more centrally located and asked Cheryl to convey that idea to the Judge's Committee.

While reviewing prior Judge's Committee reports it was discovered that back in July of 2005 a recommendation was made and approved that all Alpaca fleece judges would be grandfathered in as Llama Fleece judges. After reviewing files, it was noted that Dr Anthony Stachowski was missed on this. So at this time the committee would like to recommend that Dr Anthony Stachowski be approved as a Llama Fleece judge with a 5 year designation.

The Board does not have enough information to make a decision on this recommendation as it involves something that happened 13 years ago and there is no explanation as to why this request is being made now, nor any information about Dr Stachowski's qualifications to judge llama fleece.

Motion by Cheryl to table discussion of this recommendation until the Judge's Committee provides more information, seconded by Bill and unanimously approved.

We would also like to recommend Patti Morgan as an Alpaca Fleece judge with a 5 year designation based on her fleece experience and for the additional reasons: June 2008 Llama Fleece judge approval

September 2012 Approved as Llama Fleece Assistant Instructor by board

December 2013 Approved as a Llama Fleece Instructor and Alpaca Fleece apprentice by board January 2015 completed an alpaca fleece apprenticeship with Karen Kinyon at National Western Stock show in Denver.

Motion by Cheryl to approve Patti Morgan as an Alpaca Fleece Judge with a 5 year designation, seconded by Debbie and unanimously approved.

However, it seems most appropriate to have the Youth Committee consider this issue as it relates to all youth, whether they are showing llamas or alpacas.

We know that there are already show superintendents and ALSA member ranches that offer free miniclinics and learning opportunities in connection with shows, especially smaller 4-H shows. However, it certainly wouldn't hurt to encourage more ALSA members to get involved in these efforts.

Could you and the members of the Youth Committee please put your heads together and consider ways to reach out to event organizers and 4-H leaders about providing educational opportunities to get more youth involved in showing llamas and alpacas? Maybe an article for Showring or an e-mail blast?

Please report whatever you come up with to Bill, as he is your liaison. Thank you.

After getting everyone's opinion, we would like to recommend that the ALSA office reach out to all ALSA members to see who would be interested in helping youth in their area get involved in llamas and alpacas and be willing to have their information published and circulated. Once we have that list complied we could send that along with information about ALSA and what we do for youth and why they would want to get involved, to each state FFA and 4H office that we have members willing to participate with youth. We think that would be a good less costly alternative to see what kind of response we get. If we do get a great response then we could discuss clinics or other in person activities. The other thing the committee did bring forward was that the cost of ALSA may be keeping youth and families away. We would also like to recommend a "Club Membership" where anyone in the club would be covered for that membership fee. We hope these recommendations help and bring more youth into our industry.

ALSA AD HOC Committee February 27,2018 Meeting Minutes and Recommendations to the Board Meeting Called to Order at 8:03PM Eastern Time Roll Call: President: Jim Doyle Ethics Chair: Cheryl Lambert Show Management Chair: Kathy Devaul Judges: Margaret Henry Performance Chair: Anna Reese ALSA Office Staff: Robin Turell

The Meeting began with Jim Doyle outlining why this committee was formed based on the February 13, 2018 Board of Directors meeting. At which time the Jim asked Cheryl Lambert, Ethics Chair, to explain the situation at hand, along with the proposed solution that was made to the Board, along with an explanation of the Letter that was sent to the Board. Cheryl briefed the committee on the details of the ethical situation; but first and foremost she reemphasized that it was not her intent to pick on any specific exhibitor, but continued to explain a difficult situation for show superintendents when an exhibitor enters an animal in a Masters Performance class that has not qualified for that division by earning an Advanced Performance Championship but which has entered Master classes in prior shows. This is a rule in the handbook that goes back to when the Master Class was created and can be referenced in a 2012 Handbook that she had possession of. There has been much discussion amongst exhibitor's since the ALSA Email Blast dated March 16th that the Rule had been changed in 2015 and that they were not aware of this change. This however is not true as to the only change made to this rule was the addition in 2014 Handbook that once an animal was placed in a Master class it cannot go back to advance. The only change in 2015 was the required amount in a class from 6 to 5. She further stated as per the Handbook that it is the Exhibitors Responsibility to place animals in the correct classes.

The Proposed solution that Cheryl Lambert presented to the ALSA Board was to have the exhibitors entering the Master's Division be required to provide proof to each show superintendent that their animal has actually qualified by earning an Advanced Performance Championship and the actual shows that the animal earned to qualify to move up. This would allow for the Superintendent to quickly look and verify and possibly correct if there is a misunderstanding to a SHOW Grand and RESERVE versus Performance Grand and Reserve.

The committee then had a lengthy discussion on how to move forward, potential suspensions, along with many other potential solutions.

The committee decided to break this situation into three motions.

A Motion was made for the Following (Lambert was requested to state the Motion for the Committee)

A **Motion** to Grandfather all Animals that have been in Masters classes prior to February 13, 2018 ALSA Board of Directors meeting, and that moving forward all exhibitors be required to provide all superintendents when moving an animal up to a MASTER classes that they provide the actual shows that allowed the animal to qualify. And that said Superintendent must verify that the Animal is a qualified Advanced Performance Champion.

Second by Margaret Henry

Jim Called for the Vote and the Motion Passed unanimously – Anna Yes, Kathy yes, Cheryl Yes, Margret Yes

Rational: By putting a stake in the ground and moving forward would allow for the organization to move forward and acknowledge and address the problem. Although this may be considered by some that the organization is allowing for bad behavior, the committee felt that the damage of going back through all records, stripping exhibitors of awards that innocently without knowing other animals did not qualify, the massive time for the ALSA Office to go through every record, the Data base not being able to handle all of the changes, and so on it would be better to put the stake in the ground and moving forward address any and all violations.

The Committee then discussed how to handle violations. In a lengthy discussion, a motion was put together by all the committee's opinions as follows:

A Motion for the Following (Lambert was requested to state the Motion for the Committee)

A Motion that ALSA Office when reviewing Show Results see a potential violation within a MASTER's Performance Classes that it is brought to the Ethics Chair and this Committee to further investigate. If a Violation was found, there will be a recommendation made to the BOD for up to a 1 Year Suspension to the following: **Ranch/Farm, Exhibitor, Animal, and Show Superintendent.**

This motion was seconded by both Anna Reese and Margaret Henry Jim Called for the Vote and the Motion Passed unanimously – Anna Yes, Kathy yes, Cheryl Yes, Margaret Yes

Rational: Based on the fact that it is the Exhibitors responsibility to properly enter their animals in the correct divisions it is also the Superintendents responsibility to verify all new animal move ups and that the animal in fact is a qualified Advanced Performance Animal that a 1 year suspension for the Ranch/Farm, exhibitor, animal and superintendent should be recommended. This allows for fairness to all exhibitors and stops further violations.

The last discussion the committee had was the required size of classes to count for Performance Animals. The discussion was around not having enough animals to have a qualified Advanced class and a qualified Master class that the superintendents are not combining the classes as stated in the handbook as their option. Therefore, the class would count for Performance Champions. Also a potential and final fix to the Master Class problem is that we reduce the required class amount based on shows Master class entries across the nation.

A Motion for the Following (Lambert was requested to state the Motion for the Committee)

A Motion To Highly recommend to all show superintendents to combine Advance and Master Classes as per the ALSA Handbook so that the have the number of entries for Grand and Reserve to count for Performance. And that the class requirement for Master's is changed from 5 to 3 for all Grands and Reserves to count for Performance Champions.

This motion was seconded by both Anna Reese and Margaret Henry Jim Called for the Vote and the Motion Passed unanimously – Anna Yes, Kathy yes, Cheryl Yes, Margaret Yes

Rational: The committee discussed how across the country the average number of entries in Master Classes were 3. By reducing the required number of 5 to 3 would assist in resolving why exhibitors were entering animals who were not qualified to be in Masters in the first place. Also by reminding the Superintendents that they have the right to combine the Masters and Advance classes as per the handbook, would also resolve the required entry of 5 in advance and allow for the classes to count for Performance Champions.

It is requested that the ALSA Board of Directors accept this committee's report/minutes along with the committee's recommendations of all **three** motions so that this organization along with all of the future shows has a clear guideline of the rules and potential repercussions to violations moving forward. We ask that you approved the three motions as a slate, and that once approved an email blast can go out to all exhibitors, superintendents and show management as soon as possible.

Jim made a Motion to adjourn the meeting

Seconded by all and approved by all.

After calling the meeting to order, Jim asked Cheryl Lambert to address the Board regarding an ethical issue that has come to her attention. This issue is of concern to her as Chair of the Ethics and Protest Committees, and also as a show superintendent. She emphasized that it was not her intent to pick on any specific exhibitor, but wanted to propose a possible solution to a difficult situation for show superintendents when an exhibitor enters an animal in a Masters Performance class that has not qualified for that division by earning an Advanced Performance Championship but which has entered Master classes in prior shows. She has reason to believe this issue may cause problems at a show next weekend and would appreciate direction from the Board.

A lengthy discussion was had about what to do to prevent this from happening again in the future as well as the impact of retroactively disqualifying animals. It was noted that it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure their animal is entered in the correct class. It was suggested that exhibitors entering the Masters Division be required to provide proof to each show superintendent that their animal has actually qualified by earning an Advanced Performance Championship.

It was agreed that a thorough investigation and more discussion needs to take place before the Board can decide upon an ultimate solution, but in the meantime we need to provide an answer for the show next weekend.

Motion by Cheryl to not require the superintendent to disqualify the animal in question at the show next weekend, with the understanding that the Board is still investigating and discussing the issue. Seconded by Bill. Roll call vote: Cheryl aye; Debbie aye; Larry aye; Bill aye. Motion carries.

Jim thanked Cheryl Lambert for attending and explaining this situation to the Board. He also thanked her for her work as a show superintendent.

Bill asked Cheryl Lambert about her opinion as to why people are reluctant to file protests when violations of the rules occur. She said the two reasons she has heard is that the protest fee is too high and people don't want to cause a ruckus.

BOD Meeting - Office Report Tuesday, February 13th, 2018

1. Memberships

ALSA Exhibitors need to know that the 2017 results from the Indiana State Fair Llama & Alpaca Show are not posted with ALSA.

- We cannot verify any results that are not given to the ALSA office with the judges' cards.
- The results, fee, judges card and recap sheet have not been received by ALSA.
- The fee that the ALSA exhibitors paid was not received by the ALSA office. We do not know where this fee has gone.

The "TOP 10 YOUTH AWARD" overall points for 2017 cannot be calculated until the final results are received in order to be fair to all ALSA youth.

After discussion it was agreed that Jim will contact the ILR office to see if the results might have been mailed there by mistake. Dear Board Members,

Re: Exploiting a Sanctioned Class

We are very concerned that a member was allowed to exploit a sanctioned class where the outcome was predetermined for a certain llama and owner to win a championship. (ALSA BOD Minutes, Jan. 9, 2018) If the claims could be proven through show records, and named entries violated a standing rule (qualifying for Master Performance Classes), then it should have been viewed as a gross violation against the association and the BOD should have acted upon it immediately. All Grands earned from said llama(s) should have been voided and members who knowingly were involved should have had their membership suspended. Being allowed to manipulate a class in such a manner should never be tolerated in *any* show association regardless if a "formal" protest has been filed or not, how long ago this practice was done, or by whom.

There are many reasons why a member will not file a formal protest, with the high out-of-pocket cost probably being the main cause followed by lack of faith in the Association. By having discrepancy on interpretation of ALSA rules between committees, it is not worth the risk of the protest being found invalid and lose the \$250.00 protest fee. With this said, the ruling on requirements for showing in

Master Division is clearly written in the current handbook and states the class is "for all animals **that have completed** the requirements for an ALSA Advanced Performance Champion". This leaves no room for misinterpretation. As keeper of members' points and achievements, ALSA should had known this infraction and disqualified the llamas immediately.

We recently attended several shows where unqualified llamas entered in the Master Divisions were clearly not trained at master level and unable to do even half the obstacles. We feel this degrades the overall value of the Master Class but the violation of "cheating the system" regardless of what class, degrades not only the authentication of ALSA's Championships but ALSA as a whole, undermining their trustworthiness and integrity. With a BOD panel that turns a blind eye to such behavior based on "no formal protest", is this sending the message that a member can do whatever as long as no-one complains? Shame on you all!

It was agreed that the Board has to take decisive steps to ensure this problem is corrected. Jim will form an ad hoc committee including the chairs of the Ethics, Judges, Show Management and Performance Committees to investigate and recommend a solution. Cheryl is instructed to draft a letter to the members thanking them for bringing this to the Board's attention.

Correspondence from Members:

This request is being made on behalf of the Grand Mesa Llama and Alpaca Club. The Club has hosted the Grand Mesa and Kokopelli Llama Shows in Grand Junction for many years. As the llama community has gotten smaller, so have our shows and we operate on a very tight budget.

In May 2017 we were forced to cancel our shows at the last minute due to an unusual late snow storm which made it dangerous and almost impossible for exhibitors to travel across the mountains to get to Grand Junction. It just wasn't worth people risking their lives and animals for a llama show.

In fairness to the exhibitors we refunded all entry fees. Unfortunately the airlines, hotels and Mesa County Fairgrounds were not as generous so we ended up paying for many expenses without any income to cover them. I am therefore requesting that the \$75 of sanctioning fees that were paid to ALSA for the 2017 shows be applied to the 2018 Grand Mesa and Kokopelli Llama Shows. Please let me know if this will be possible. Thank you.

Ad hoc Committee's investigation and recommendation re violation of rule re qualification for Master Performance classes –

ALSA AD HOC Committee February 27,2018 Meeting Minutes and Recommendations to the Board Meeting Called to Order at 8:03PM Eastern Time Roll Call: President: Jim Doyle Ethics Chair: Cheryl Lambert Show Management Chair: Kathy Devaul Judges: Margaret Henry Performance Chair: Anna Reese ALSA Office Staff: Robin Turell

The Meeting began with Jim Doyle outlining why this committee was formed based on the February 13, 2018 Board of Directors meeting. At which time the Jim asked Cheryl Lambert, Ethics Chair, to explain the situation at hand, along with the proposed solution that was made to the Board, along with an explanation of the Letter that was sent to the Board. Cheryl briefed the committee on the details of the ethical situation; but first and foremost she reemphasized that it was not her intent to pick on any specific exhibitor, but continued to explain a difficult situation for show superintendents when an exhibitor enters an animal in a Masters Performance class that has not qualified for that division by earning an Advanced Performance Championship but which has entered Master classes in prior shows. This is a rule in the handbook that goes back to when the Master Class was created and can be referenced in a 2012 Handbook that she had possession of. There has been much discussion amongst exhibitor's since the ALSA Email Blast dated March 16th that the Rule had been changed in 2015 and that they were not aware of this change. This however is not true as to the only change made to this rule was the addition in 2014 Handbook that once an animal was placed in a Master class it cannot go back to advance. The only change in 2015 was the required amount in a class from 6 to 5. She further stated as per the Handbook that it is the Exhibitors Responsibility to place animals in the correct classes.

The Proposed solution that Cheryl Lambert presented to the ALSA Board was to have the exhibitors entering the Master's Division be required to provide proof to each show superintendent that their animal has actually qualified by earning an Advanced Performance Championship and the actual shows that the animal earned to qualify to move up. This would allow for the Superintendent to quickly look and verify and possibly correct if there is a misunderstanding to a SHOW Grand and RESERVE versus Performance Grand and Reserve.

The committee then had a lengthy discussion on how to move forward, potential suspensions, along with many other potential solutions.

The committee decided to break this situation into three motions.

A Motion was made for the Following (Lambert was requested to state the Motion for the Committee)

A **Motion** to Grandfather all Animals that have been in Masters classes prior to February 13, 2018 ALSA Board of Directors meeting, and that moving forward all exhibitors be required to provide all superintendents when moving an animal up to a MASTER classes that they provide the actual shows that allowed the animal to qualify. And that said Superintendent must verify that the Animal is a qualified Advanced Performance Champion.

Second by Margaret Henry

Jim Called for the Vote and the Motion Passed unanimously – Anna Yes, Kathy yes, Cheryl Yes, Margret Yes

Rational: By putting a stake in the ground and moving forward would allow for the organization to move forward and acknowledge and address the problem. Although this may be considered by some that the organization is allowing for bad behavior, the committee felt that the damage of going back through all records, stripping exhibitors of awards that innocently without knowing other animals did not qualify, the massive time for the ALSA Office to go through every record, the Data base not being able to handle all of the changes, and so on it would be better to put the stake in the ground and moving forward address any and all violations.

The Committee then discussed how to handle violations. In a lengthy discussion, a motion was put together by all the committee's opinions as follows:

A Motion for the Following (Lambert was requested to state the Motion for the Committee)

A Motion that ALSA Office when reviewing Show Results see a potential violation within a MASTER's Performance Classes that it is brought to the Ethics Chair and this Committee to further investigate. If a Violation was found, there will be a recommendation made to the BOD for up to a 1 Year Suspension to the following: **Ranch/Farm, Exhibitor, Animal, and Show Superintendent.**

This motion was seconded by both Anna Reese and Margaret Henry Jim Called for the Vote and the Motion Passed unanimously – Anna Yes, Kathy yes, Cheryl Yes, Margaret Yes

Rational: Based on the fact that it is the Exhibitors responsibility to properly enter their animals in the correct divisions it is also the Superintendents responsibility to verify all new animal move ups and that the animal in fact is a qualified Advanced Performance Animal that a 1 year suspension for the Ranch/Farm, exhibitor, animal and superintendent should be recommended. This allows for fairness to all exhibitors and stops further violations.

The last discussion the committee had was the required size of classes to count for Performance Animals. The discussion was around not having enough animals to have a qualified Advanced class and a qualified Master class that the superintendents are not combining the classes as stated in the handbook as their option. Therefore, the class would count for Performance Champions. Also a potential and final fix to the Master Class problem is that we reduce the required class amount based on shows Master class entries across the nation.

A Motion for the Following (Lambert was requested to state the Motion for the Committee)

A Motion To Highly recommend to all show superintendents to combine Advance and Master Classes as per the ALSA Handbook so that the have the number of entries for Grand and Reserve to count for Performance. And that the class requirement for Master's is changed from 5 to 3 for all Grands and Reserves to count for Performance Champions.

This motion was seconded by both Anna Reese and Margaret Henry Jim Called for the Vote and the Motion Passed unanimously – Anna Yes, Kathy yes, Cheryl Yes, Margaret Yes

Rational: The committee discussed how across the country the average number of entries in Master Classes were 3. By reducing the required number of 5 to 3 would assist in resolving why exhibitors were entering animals who were not qualified to be in Masters in the first place. Also by reminding the Superintendents that they have the right to combine the Masters and Advance classes as per the handbook, would also resolve the required entry of 5 in advance and allow for the classes to count for Performance Champions.

It is requested that the ALSA Board of Directors accept this committee's report/minutes along with the committee's recommendations of all **three** motions so that this organization along with all of the future shows has a clear guideline of the rules and potential repercussions to violations moving forward. We ask that you approved the three motions as a slate, and that once approved an email blast can go out to all exhibitors, superintendents and show management as soon as possible.

Jim made a Motion to adjourn the meeting

Seconded by all and approved by all.

Meeting adjourned at 9:03 Eastern Standard Time. Respectfully Submitted March 1, 2018 By Cheryl Lambert Ethic Chair and requested recording secretary of this committee meeting
