Join us at the Georgia National Fairgrounds in Perry, Georgia and enjoy some llama and alpaca fair fun and fellowship! The Southeast Show Team (2KC) is looking forward for our upcoming 2026 2KC Invitational Llama Show and the 2026 ALSA Southeast Regional shows on October 16-18, 2026. Deadline: Package must be in Kathy Devaul's hands no later than September 25, 2026. We look forward to seeing you at the show. We greatly appreciate all our sponsors and supporters.

The 2KC Invitational and the ALSA Southeast Regional shows will utilize Practice Arena 2 for showing and stall in Horse Barn 2 for stalling, check-in, and Sunday's Awards Breakfast at the Georgia National Fairgrounds in Perry, Georgia. Please check in at the Horse Barn 2 upon arrival to receive your stalling assignments and show package.

FAIR WRISTBANDS AND PARKING PASS Deadlines and Rules:

The Georgia National Fair is requiring all livestock exhibitors to arrive with their fair wristbands and parking passes and enter at the East Gate. To ensure timely receipt of these materials, exhibitors are required to submit their wristband and parking pass requests no later than September 15th directly to Kathy Devaul by email at kdevaul2@gmail.com. She will process your request and mail through the United States Postal Service to deliver the items, ensuring that all exhibitors arrive fully prepared.

All livestock (llamas and alpacas) exhibitors must arrive at the East Gate Horse and RV Entrance at the Georgia National Fairgrounds with their required Georgia National Fairground's livestock show wristbands and parking passes. Exhibitors who fail to bring these items will be required to park out in the camper parking outside the East Gate Horse & RV Entrance security gate and enter the fairgrounds as a regular fair attendee at a main gate, at their own expense, in order to collect their wristbands and parking passes from the Southeast Show Team 2KC in the stalling barn. Lost or forgotten packages aren't the responsibility of the Georgia National Fairgrounds or the Southeast Show Team 2KC.

Our 2KC Invitational challenges and fun competitions. This show will draw tons of spectators and opportunities to reach out to future camelid owners. This allows us all the time to showcase our passions for our camelid friends. These competitions seem appropriate:

Poster Competition (Fair Competition Only-not sanctioned)

The official guidelines and scoring criteria for the **Educational Poster Competition** at the **2KC Invitational Llama Show** are detailed below. This competition challenges youth and adult exhibitors to design a visually captivating, accurate display that teaches both the general public and experienced owners about camelid care, biology, or industry standards.

General Guidelines & Rules

Event Details

- **Location:** [Georgia National Fairgrounds & Agricenter](#) in Perry, Georgia.
- **Show Dates:** October 16–18, 2026.
- **Submission Deadline:** Posters must be turned in to the Show Superintendent, Kathy Devaul by **Friday, October 16, 2026, at 5:00 PM.**

Physical Requirements

- **Standard Dimensions:** Must be exactly 22 inches X 28 inches.
- **Material Base:** Standard poster board or foam core board only.
- **Orientation:** Must be designed and displayed horizontally (landscape orientation).
- **Display Ready:** Flat design only. No three-dimensional attachments or folding tri-fold boards allowed.
- **Exhibitor Identification:** Name, age division (Youth or Adult), and Farm name must be written clearly on the **back** of the poster. No identifying marks are allowed on the front.

Content & Topic Requirements

- **Core Subject:** Must focus strictly on llamas, alpacas, or general camelid topics.
- **Target Audience:** Content must be dual-purpose, offering accessible facts for the general public and useful insights for camelid owners.
- **Suggested but not required Themes:**
 - Camelid anatomy
 - Structural soundness
 - Fiber types
 - Fiber harvesting and processing

- Suri Network vs. Huacaya
 - Nutritional requirements
 - Toxic pasture plants
 - General herd health
 - Body condition scoring
 - Daily management.
 - Historical origins of South American camelids.

Scoring Criteria (100-Point Scale)

Posters will be evaluated by Show judges using the following four-part rubric:

1. Educational Value & Content Accuracy (40 Points)

- **Fact Check (20 pts):** Information must be scientifically valid and free of myths or outdated herd management practices.
- **Public Clarity (10 pts):** Complex topics must be translated into simple universal terms easily understood by a non-farming fair visitor.
- **Owner Utility (10 pts):** Includes practical data, diagrams, or tips that offer value to active camelid breeders.

2. Visual Appeal & Design (30 Points)

- **Layout Balance (10 pts):** Effective use of whitespace. The board must not feel overcrowded or entirely blank.
- **Color & Contrast (10 pts):** Text colors must highly contrast with the background for immediate readability from a distance of 4 feet.
- **Illustration Quality (10 pts):** Drawings, diagrams, or photos must be high-resolution, neatly trimmed, and purposefully placed.

3. Text & Readability (20 Points)

- **Typography (10 pts):** Main titles should be readable from 10 feet away. Body text should be neatly printed, typed, or stenciled.
- **Grammar & Mechanics (10 pts):** Zero spelling mistakes, grammatical errors, or typos. Scientific names must be formatted correctly.

4. Originality & Neatness (10 Points)

- **Creativity (5 pts):** Unique presentation angles or interesting presentation of everyday camelid facts.
- **Execution (5 pts):** Clean margins, strong adhesive work with no visible glue lines, and no bent or wrinkled poster corners.

Prizes will be given to the 1st Place Winners in the Youth and Adult divisions. One – Youth Prize and One – Adult Prize will be awarded. Judges must be in agreement. Winners will be announced at the Sunday Awards Breakfast.

Entry fee for the Poster Competition is \$5.00 per entry. Enter as many posters as you would like there is no limit.

Youth Judging (Youth Only) - Friday Night Activity- ALSA Regional

- We will need volunteers; 4 handlers and 4 animals to help with this on Friday, October 16, 2026, at approximately 7:00 p.m. Please volunteer with Kathy Devaul at check in.
- Youth, please sign up on your entry form. Please come prepared with a pen and clipboard on Friday at 7:30 p.m.

Friday night, October 16, 2026, there will be no potluck dinner.

Youth Judging will be in Practice Arena at 7:30 p.m. We need 4 volunteers with animals at approximately 7 p.m. to assist with Youth Judging. Cart Driving and Ground Driving Classes immediately after youth judging.

Saturday, October 17, 2026 – Judges/Exhibitors Meeting at 8 a.m. Performance Classes will start immediately after the judges' meeting. The Educational Stall Decoration Competition will be judged on Saturday 30 minutes after the last performance exhibitor. Cart Driving Classes, All Performance, Youth Judging and Stall Decoration winners will be announced at the Sunday Morning Awards Breakfast.

Sunday, October 18, 2026 – 7:30 a.m. Sunday Awards Breakfast, Adult Showmanship, Youth Showmanship, Halter classes, Bred and Owned, Dam and Cria, Produce of Dam, Get of Sire and Judges Choice.

The base date for computing the animal's age is October 16, 2026.

Entry fee is \$70 per llama. This includes ALSA/ILR-SD recording fees. Fees for the group classes are \$20 per entry.

Completed entry forms, fees, copies of registration papers or ILR numbers, and 2026 ALSA card must be included in your show entry package. **Package must be in Kathy Devaul's hands no later than September 25, 2026.** Failure to send an ILR number or a copy of registration papers prohibits entry in this show. Late entries will be accepted until October 16, 2026; however, a \$20 per animal fee is required.

If you don't own the llama, you must have an ALSA permission to show form. The permission to show form can be found on the ALSA website.

All exhibitors must be a current members of ILR-SD and ALSA. Please provide a copy of your 2026 ALSA Membership card.

Each youth will be allowed one youth llama at the price of \$60. This enters the llama in all youth performance classes and youth showmanship. If the animal is going to be in halter the \$70 fee is required.

We will make an attempt to run pleasure driving, obstacle driving, youth ground driving, and adult ground driving classes on Friday.

The Judges Meeting will be at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday morning in the show arena. We will follow show book order throughout the show weekend with the exception of cart driving which will be determined by the show staff and cart driving exhibitors. We are hoping cart driving and ground driving will be Friday night immediately after the Youth Judging Competition.

Stalling is available. Horse stalls. Sponsors and Show Staff will get first choice. Reserve stalls on entry form.

Hay and Straw will be available to prepurchase. Hay is \$TBA a bale. Wheat straw is \$TBA a bale. Please reserve those on your entry form. Contact Kathy Devaul for price.

Performance awards will be given during the catered Sunday Awards Breakfast at 7:30 a.m. in the Horse Barn 2 or the Fairground Restaurant. The cost per person is \$20 for breakfast. Performance and Halter competitors are all encouraged to join us.

There will be a hospitality area set up inside the Practice Arena 2.

The show will be governed by the current ALSA handbook unless site rules are enforced.

All llamas on the premises must meet health requirements and be entered in the show. Llamas/Alpacas must have a health certificate signed by a vet dated within 30 days and stating The Georgia National Fairgrounds, Perry, Georgia as the destination.

Health Requirements

In state and out of state animals:

All llamas must have a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within 30 days of the show. The certificate must show the animal's name, sex, registration number, color, and permanent identification (tattoo, microchip, or USDA ear tag) if any. If a microchip is used, the owner must provide a reader, if needed. The Georgia Department of Agriculture has waived all brucellosis and tuberculosis testing for llamas and alpacas that are exhibited in Georgia. *If animals are to remain in state from out of state, a negative brucellosis test is needed.

NOTE

Health certificate for in state and out of state animals must state intact males have 2 normal testicles: breeding females have normal external organs: or confirmation of non-breeder statues.

Check-in will begin Friday, October 16, 2026, from 9:00 a.m.- 6 p.m. Please check in with the show clerk for your stall assignments and show packages. The show clerk will be set up in the Horse Barn 2. All stalls are pre-assigned by the show superintendent. (Stalling preferences are given to show sponsors and volunteers.) Don't forget your Health Certificates! The Georgia National Fairgrounds assigns a health inspector, and they will need a health certificate prior to allowing animals to unload from the trailer. You may check in on Thursday, however, you **MUST** make prior arrangements with the show superintendent Kathy Devaul.

The handler's attire should be conservative, neat and appropriate for the class. Shoes should be appropriate for the show ring and must completely cover the foot. Inappropriate footwear will disqualify the exhibitor, who will be dismissed from the show ring immediately.

According to ALSA guidelines: It is Show Management's responsibility to dismiss an exhibitor or spectator who is abusive or who demonstrates bad sportsmanship toward the Judge, Show Personnel or any other exhibitor.

This show is designed to be a fun, easy, enjoyable experience.

All dogs **MUST** be on a leash. Owners must follow all rules and regulations of the Georgia National Fairgrounds. Dogs must behave appropriately and not disturb the exhibitors and their animals. A dog's waste must be cleaned up immediately and appropriately disposed of; this is the responsibility of the owner.

Class placement ribbons, Overall Performance Awards and one Judge's Choice Award will be awarded per judge.

Non ILR registered llamas or llamas without an ILR listing number may show in the Performance, Showmanship, Youth division or other optional classes ONLY after obtaining an ILR tracking number. There will be an annual fee of \$10.00 for this tracking number.

All youth ages are determined as of January 1, except for 8-year-olds who are considered 8 as of their birthday. If a youth shows in an adult showmanship class, they are no longer eligible to show in the youth showmanship classes. The youth classes may be combined as seen fit by the superintendents.

Youth Classes are for the youth. Youth may exhibit only one entry per Youth class. The same animal shall NOT be entered in 2 different performance divisions.

Entries in performance classes are restricted in that an animal may be entered in the Youth classes OR the non-youth classes (novice, advanced, and masters) but not both.
