The Winter Wonderland Llama Show, celebrate the holidays with us at Willow Tree Farm located at 609 Post Oak Road, Ringgold, Georgia to enjoy some llama and alpaca fun and fellowship! It will be a great opportunity to showcase your herd, show off your llamas and alpacas and your skills. Southeast Show Team (2KC) is looking forward for our upcoming 2026 Winter Wonderland Llama Show on November 20-22, 2026. Deadline: Package must be received by October 30, 2026. We look forward to seeing you and greatly appreciate all our sponsors and supporters.

Southeast Show Team 2KC is hoping to create a fun and fantastic show for all! New awards...new challenges... and always fun!

Our Winter Wonderland show challenge and fun competition. This show will draw tons of spectators and opportunities to reach out to future camelid owners. This allows us all the time to showcase our passions for our camelid friends. Adults and Youth Competition.

This competition seems appropriate:

- 1. Costume and story contests that includes you and your camelid(s).**
 - a. Judged on the best overall story content and appearance that ties it all together in celebration for the holiday season.**
 - b. This will be judged by our Judges approximately an hour prior to our Awards Dinner on Saturday.**
 - c. Timing and location will be announced after the completion to the Public Relation class.**
 - d. One adult winner judges must agree and one youth winner must agree.**
- (Two prizes will be given)**

Friday night, November 20, 2026, will be our "Potluck" dinner at 6 p.m. Please let Kim Kyst know what you will be contributing to the shared Potluck dinner. kim@kyst.org
Southeast Show Team will be providing Chili and Baked Potatoes, all the paper products, plasticware, teas and ice. Please bring items to share and create a full Chili and Potato bar.

Saturday, November 21, 2026 – Judges/Exhibitors Meeting. Performance Classes. The Costume contest. All Performance and Costume winners will be announced at the Saturday Night Awards Dinner. Currently we are planning our Awards Dinner for Saturday at approximately 6 p.m. It will be 2 hours after the Public Relations Class finishes. This will allow the score table staff the opportunity to tally all the performance cards and prepare the awards.

Sunday, November 22, 2026 – Showmanship, Halter classes, Dam and Cria, Bred and Owned, Produce of Dam, Get of Sire and Judges Choice.

The base date for computing the animal's age is November 20, 2026.

Entry fee is \$70 per llama. This includes ALSA/ILR-SD recording fees. Fees for the group classes are \$20 per entry.

Complete entry forms, fees, copies of registration papers or ILR numbers, and 2026 ALSA card must be included in your show entry package. Package must be received no later than October 30, 2026. Failure to send an ILR number or a copy of registration papers prohibits entry in this show. Late entries will be accepted until November 20, 2026; however, a \$20 per animal fee is required.

If you don't own the llama, you must have an ALSA permission to show form. The permission to show form can be found on the ALSA website.

All exhibitors must be a current member of ILR and ALSA. Please provide a copy of your 2026 ALSA Membership card.

Each youth will be allowed one youth llama at the price of \$60. This enters the llama in all youth performance classes and youth showmanship. If the animal is going to be in halter the \$70 fee is required.

We will make an attempt to run pleasure driving, obstacle driving, youth ground driving, and adult ground driving classes Friday night.

The Judges Meeting will be at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday morning in the show arena. We will follow show book order throughout the show weekend.

Stalls are extremely limited. Sponsors and Show Staff will get first choice until gone. Please book stalls with Stacy Mashburn via text at 423-421-3300 to confirm availability. Stall fees are \$35 and payable to Stacy Mashburn.

Performance awards will be given out during the catered dinner Saturday night. The cost per person is \$20 for dinner. Performance and Halter competitors are all encouraged to join us. The Awards Dinner will be Saturday afternoon two hours after the final competitor competes in the Public Relation Class. Dinner will be in the pavilion.

There will be a hospitality area set up inside the pavilion.

The show will be governed by the current ALSA handbook unless site rules are enforced.

Llamas/Alpacas must have a health certificate signed by a vet dated within 30 days and stating The Willow Tree Farm Llama Show, Ringgold, Georgia as the destination.

Check-in will begin Friday, November 20, 2026, from 9:00 a.m.- 6 p.m. Please check in with the show clerk for your stall assignments. The show clerk will be set up at the pavilion. All stalls are pre-assigned by Stacy Mashburn. To reserve stalls contact Stacy Mashburn via text at 423-421-3300 to confirm availability (Stalling preferences are given to show sponsors and volunteers.) You will receive your show packet at this time. Don't forget your Health Certificates! You may check in on Thursday, however, you **MUST** make prior arrangements with the show superintendent-Kathy Devaul.

The handler's attire should be conservative, neat and appropriate for the class. Shoes should be appropriate for the show ring and must completely cover the foot. Inappropriate footwear will disqualify the exhibitor, who will be dismissed from the show ring immediately.

According to ALSA guidelines: It is Show Management's responsibility to dismiss an exhibitor or spectator who is abusive or who demonstrates bad sportsmanship toward the Judge, Show Personnel or any other exhibitor.

This show is designed to be a fun, easy, enjoyable experience.

All dogs **MUST** be on a leash and behave appropriately. A dog's waste must be cleaned up immediately and appropriately disposed of, this is the responsibility of the owner.

All llamas on the premises must meet health requirements and be entered in the show.

Class placement ribbons, Overall Performance Awards and one Judge's Choice Award will be awarded per judge.

Non ILR registered llamas or llamas without an ILR listing number may show in the Performance, Showmanship, Youth division or other optional classes **ONLY** after obtaining an ILR tracking number. There will be an annual fee of \$10.00 for this tracking number.

All youth ages are determined as of January 1, except for 8-year-old who are considered 8 as of their birthday. If a youth shows in an adult showmanship class, they are no longer eligible to show in the youth showmanship classes. The youth classes may be combined as seen fit by the superintendents.

Youth Classes are for the youth. Youth may exhibit only one entry per Youth class. The same animal shall **NOT** be entered in 2 different performance divisions.

Entries in performance classes are restricted in that an animal may be entered in the Youth classes OR the non-youth classes (novice, advanced, and masters) but not both.

Health Requirements

In state and out of state animals:

All llamas must have a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within 30 days of the show. The certificate must show the animal's name, sex, registration number, color, and permanent identification (tattoo, microchip, or USDA ear tag) if any. If a microchip is used, the owner must provide a reader, if needed. The Georgia Department of Agriculture has waived all brucellosis and tuberculosis testing for llamas and alpacas that are exhibited in Georgia.

*If animals are to remain in state from out of state, a negative brucellosis test is needed.

NOTE

Health certificate for in state and out of state animals must state intact males have 2 normal testicles: breeding females have normal external organs: or confirmation of non-breeder statues.

Motor Homes

Motor Home accommodation with hook ups are limited. They will be reserved on a first come first serve basis until all spaces are filled. Motor Home hook up can be reserved by contacting Stacy Mashburn via text at 423-421-3300 to confirm availability. Motor Home connections are paid directly to Stacy Mashburn.
